FAIR HOUSING CENTER ANNOUNCES NEW HIRES

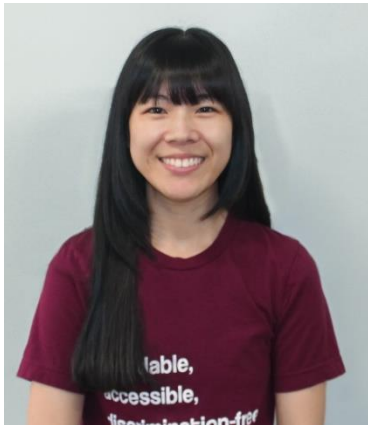
