**FAIR HOUSING CENTER OF CENTRAL INDIANA ANNOUNCES  
FAIR HOUSING MONTH ACTIVITIES**

INDIANAPOLIS – Every April is celebrated across the nation as Fair Housing Month to honor the original passage of the federal Fair Housing Act in April 1968. This year marks the 58<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the signing of the Act into law. In honor, the Fair Housing Center of Central Indiana (FHCCI) has a month of targeted activities in celebration and recognition of fair housing and the passage of this important civil rights law.

The [FHCCI's 14th Annual Fair Housing Conference](#), with a theme of *Fair Housing: Investing in Stable Housing*, will be held virtually from 9:00 AM to 4:45 PM (ET) on Wednesday, April 8, 2026. The conference will offer 15 topical themed workshops on various fair housing issues through three defined tracts. Topics will include Fair Housing 101; Disability Housing Case Law Update; Homelessness – Myths, Stigma, and Real Solutions; Fair Sales Update; Harassment in Housing; 50 Years of the Home Mortgage Disclosure Act (HMDA); Insuring the American Dream; Identifying Housing Scams; Private Equity in our Mobile Home Communities; Property Tax 101; Evictions and Habitability Concerns in Rental Housing; Indiana General Assembly Update; Utilities; and updates on lending and rental based housing discrimination.

Acclaimed journalist, Megan Greenwell, will be the conference's keynote speaker. Ms. Greenwell is the author of [BAD COMPANY: Private Equity and the Death of the American Dream](#). Pre-registration has already surpassed 400 registrants. The conference was also approved for 6.3 CLEs for Indiana practicing attorneys.
